As a family of faith, we are committed to serving those in our community who are in need. At this time, you are encouraged to step up your support of the food pantry ministry through your donations and prayers. Contributions of non-perishable food and/or monetary donations are always welcome. However, during the month of November we are asking you to contribute non-food household items that may not be purchased with SNAP benefits (formerly known as food stamps).

Children who have been impacted by civil unrest, natural disaster, disease, and poverty were blessed by the toys, candy, school supplies, and personal items we sent. Even more important was the message they heard about the God who loves them.

God allows us to participate in his work in reaching out to hurting children. He has a plan for each shoebox that we pack. The ball you pack may be just what a lonely child needs to make a friend. The hand-knit hat you place in a box may keep a refugee in a camp from getting frostbite. Attending school could be possible for the child
