Simple Gifts Open Doors ~ A Modern-day Nicodemus

We are familiar with the story of Nicodemus, the Pharisee who went to see Jesus under the cover of darkness (John 3:1-21). Having knowledge of Jesus' teachings and healings, Nicodemus needed to know more about this man he considered to be a "teacher come from God." Fearing repercussions from the

Jewish leaders, he went to see Jesus in secret.

Josephine is the Discipleship Coordinator for Operation Christmas Child in Northern Mali.* Following a shoebox distribution in a remote village, her team was camping by a river. That night a young mother in full burqa, with only the slit for her eyes visible, came to ask questions. She shared, "All my life I have been taught to hate Christians but this gift that you gave my child is so generous, could you tell me more about your Jesus?" That night on the riverbank Josephine was able to lead this young mother to Christ. She is now a secret believer.
