Since 2010 we have tracked the destinations of the shoeboxes we have packed for Operation Christmas Child. Our gifts have blessed children in


36 different countries. We do not know where this year's gifts will be distributed, but we may be certain that they will be given with the love of Jesus.

Project Heat Fundraisers

In January, we shared news that the boilers for the church heating system needed to be replaced. Because this was a major expense, consistory decided to take some of the cost out of investments and attempt to raise \$ 30,000 through a letter appeal and various fundraising events. The church has been blessed with many donations made directly to the boiler replacement fund. Meanwhile, our fundraisers were a lot of fun while contributing to the goal set in January.

The fun started with "Guess Who's Coming to Dinner" where dinner was provided by a host and the guests, who made a donation for the meal, were kept secret. Sharing a meal together has the added benefit of great fellowship. Next, we held a two day bake sale at Barber's Greenhouses on Mother's Day weekend. It was a rainy weekend but the baked goods were delicious and sales were great.

In May, we hosted a Quilt and Fiber Art show and began a raffle of two beautiful quilts donated by Joan Youmans and Ron & Edna Lower. Over 100 fiber arts pieces were displayed in the sanctuary including quilts belonging to Anne Doerge, Ellie Spencer and Marian Lynes-Bouck. It was a lovely way to remember these amazing women. Tea and cookies were served in the "Tea Room" fellowship hall where Deborah Gibbons displayed her antique sewing machines and Laura Milak demonstrated felting.



In June, we had a pre-sale chicken barbeque and bake sale. Volunteers put the dinners together in the foyer where our quilts were again on display. Our traditional Trash and Treasure Sale was held in July so the proceeds could be added during our fundraising goal deadline. Drawing for the quilts was in the Middleburgh Library on July 27.

We reached our \$ 30,000 goal by the end of July. Thank you to all those who donated in anyway and participated in the very busy fundraising schedule from January to July. Project Heat updates will be reported in a future newsletter.
